A \$50 deposit will secure your child's place at camp.

Preparing Financially:

We realize there are families that may not be able to cover the whole cost to send all their children to camp. Financial assistance is available for families in those unique circumstances. *It is the expectation of Crossroads that families asking for assistance participate in fundraisers and other means of raising support for camp.* By starting today, families can save, work, and fundraise much of their camp expenses.

Start saving and fundraising now to cover the cost of camp. We work hard to keep the cost of camp low, but we realize it is a big commitment for many families. Here are a few ways to help cover the cost of camp.

- o <u>Payment Plans</u> It is possible to set up a payment plan for camp breaking the cost into smaller weekly or monthly payments.
- O Gift Card Fundraiser- This on-going fundraiser is a great way to gradually build up money for camp at no cost to you. Gift Cards for popular stores, restaurants, and gas stations are able to be purchased for face value with a percentage going towards your child's camp costs. - <u>Cardboard Boat Race</u> This is a fun way to raise money for camp scholarships.
 Each family builds a cardboard boat and asks for sponsors to support them as they race! Be looking for information on this event around early June.
- O Individual Family Fundraisers There are a variety of creative ways families can raise money for camp. Check out www.gofundme.com as a way to harness social media to help raise support. Get your students involved in the process: baby sit, shovel snow, mow yards, etc. A little bit of hard work and planning ahead will go a long way.

Tell me more about The Ark and what it has to offer:

The Ark has 50 wooded acres that offer great facilities. They have a conference center that has a large Gym/Multi-Purpose room, beautiful lobby with fireplace, meeting rooms, and dormitory space adjacent to modern restrooms. A full-service kitchen and staff can prepare and serve meals.

Lakeside Cabins house 16 people and have electricity, bunk beds, restrooms and showers.

Activities:

The Ark offers targeted recreation activities that are similar to our past camp, but some are new. They include: Basketball, cable swing, campfires, canoeing/kayaking, fishing, indoor high ropes course, kickball, nine square in the air, mudslide, gaga ball, paintball, sand volleyball, soccer fields, swimming pool, wagon rides, wet zip line, outdoor climbing wall

Unique to The Ark Camp:

The Ark has a Missionary on site during the whole week of camp. The missionary will be speaking/teaching to the students each day during a break out time allowing our campers to develop a relationship with a missionary family. The campers will have an opportunity to support the missionary in order to help with a specific cause.

Missionaries for 2017 are Marcus and Arin Corn. They will share their story of how God has moved in their lives to put them on the path to full time ministry in Haiti, beginning this fall. They will be serving with Haitian Christian Outreach as their Campus Managers. The compound where they will live includes a school, church, hospital and recreational areas open to the community. In addition to managing the campus, they will be heading up the Community Development area of the ministry.

Marcus and Arin have two boys Maverick (2) and Pierson (3 months). As a family, they love camping and going to the zoo.

The money raised this summer will be used to help "Launch" them to Haiti. The cost of moving a family to another county can be very expensive. The offerings will help them get set up in their new home. Since the campus is off the grid, one of the main things the money will be used for is a Solar Energy System for their home there.
